"Teaching, learning and research materials in any medium – digital or otherwise – that reside in the public domain or have been released under an open license that permits no-cost access, use, adaptation and redistribution by others with no or limited restrictions"

"Lifelong learning (LLL) enables Malaysians to meet the changing skill needs of a high-income economy and maximizes the potential of individuals who are currently outside the workforce through reskilling and upskilling opportunities. It also enables the development of personal interests and talents for a more fulfilled life. Malaysia needs to move from a world where education is seen as something that happens only during one's youth, to a world where Malaysians of all ages constantly seek out learning opportunities to enrich themselves."





Open Educational Resources

"Through OER, students and individuals are able to access the reading materials for free. This can encourage them to implement "LLL" irrespective of their age and standard of living. This is also in line with Article 26 of the United Nations Human Rights which stated that "Everyone has the right to education. Education shall be free, at least in the elementary and fundamental stages. Elementary education shall be compulsory."




Learning/Teaching Methods



- Introduce and create awareness among communities by providing free workshops, collaboration with schools/organizations, databases providers and even software suppliers.






